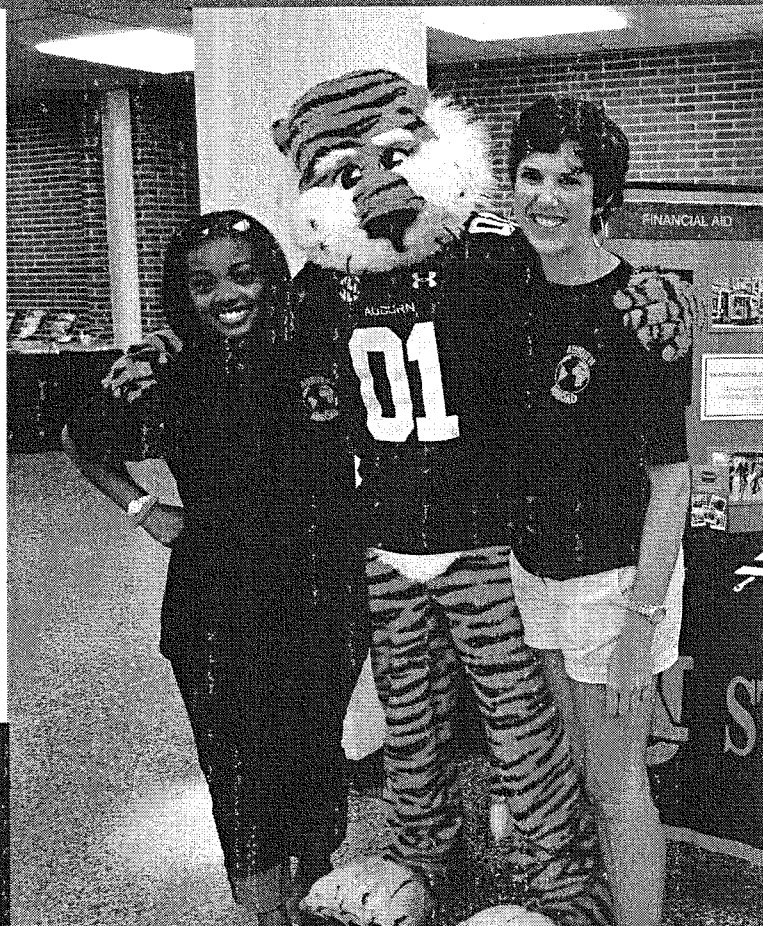

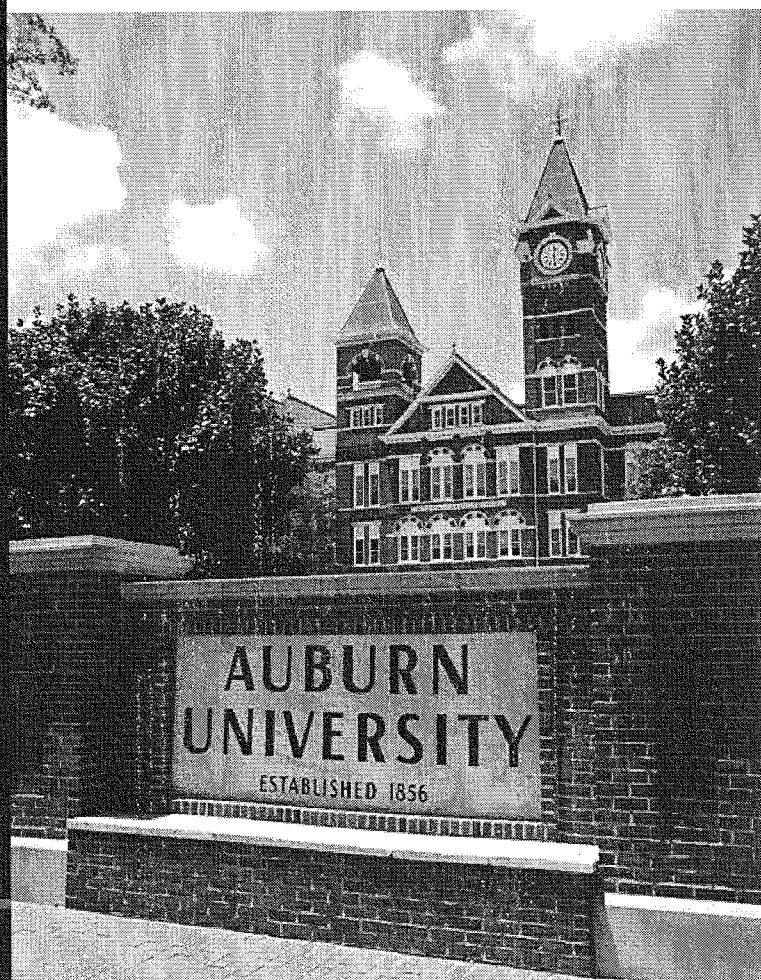

Exchange Programs

Semester Dates:

- FALL - Classes begin mid-August, examinations mid-December
- SPRING - Classes begin mid-January, examinations early May
- Exchange students should arrive a few days before the start date of classes.
Exact dates sent to students upon acceptance.

Details:

- Language of instruction is English. Proof of proficiency required.
- No tuition for bilateral exchange students. Required semester fees include \$300 dining fee, student health insurance fee (approximately \$900), and student ID card (\$25).
- Minimum enrollment in 12 U.S. credits per semester (typically 4 classes).
- Grading scale out of 100. Final passing grades are A (100-90), B (89-80), C (79-70), and D (69-60). Failing grade is F (59 and below).
- Transcript of records must be requested by the student at the end of his/her term(s) from the Office of the Registrar. Instructions provided prior to departure.
- Regarding accommodation, International Programs will support students by sending updated information upon acceptance. Early application is essential.

Application Information

DEADLINES:

FALL: March 15, SPRING: October 15

- Accommodation options fill quickly for fall semester, so it is encouraged to submit applications well in advance of the listed deadline.
- For students on business exchanges, it is very important for applications to be submitted early in order to ensure priority class enrollment.
- Applications may be accepted later than listed deadlines, but please note that late applicants may have limited accommodation and class options.
- Nominations should be sent to the exchange coordinator and faculty advisor and include name, email address, date of birth, level of study (bachelor's or master's), major of study, and term(s) at Auburn University.
